

We (Edith aged 93 in co-operation with son Peter Guyer) have eremophila Mitchellii as our PNF, we live in NW of NSW. It is a bit hard to describe our Forestry Code due to the low scale and low intensity of any harvesting operation. We believe the focus should be on the outcome and the need for approval rather than the process.

2. We believe that the PNF could also be regulated by the LLS along the lines of the current 10 and 15 year agreements that are offered to local farmers and graziers. We believe that the combination of a PNF and an LLS agreement would be practical and effective.

3. By sub-classing species, eg, E. Mitchellii and other species such as Northern Sandalwood, Western Rosewood, etc on small scale low intensity operations.

4. The continued use of the training and advice service provided by the workshops that have been carried out by the former CMA and now the present LLS would be of great benefit to landholders across the State.
