The three-day workshop aims to assist in developing advanced stock movement and management techniques, including a working dog session. The course will focus on the importance of grazing management practices. Topics covered will include:

- Grazing management practices and stock movement.
- Workplace Health and Safety - creating a safe and enjoyable working environment. Improved economic, welfare and WHS outcomes can be gained by applying the techniques demonstrated in the workshop.
- Anticipating the moves of animals - how to start, stop and create a good steady flow of livestock.
- Working with others - the importance of positive feedback and communication.
- Increased animal health and performance, which includes animal welfare.
- The importance of maintaining boss "wolf rank" with all dogs at an equal level — one rank beneath you to ensure a harmonious "camp".
